slow start, Williamstown CYMS played a high-class second half to overpower St. Marys Salesian by a big margin at Ferndale Park, Glen Iris.

In perfect conditions, SMS (tenth) took on Williamstown CYMS (top). There were 2 changes with Ollie Baxter and Jon Yodgee (first game) being the additions, and Andrew Morris playing game 100.

SMS kicked to the Pavilion end in the opening term and began OK. Dane Hicks was strong in the ruck contests and skipper Heath Chipperfield a good onballer as the team combined well to have a fifty percent share of the ball. The Saints pressure and tackling was good and there was little between the teams at this early stage. Manny Dolan kicked two goals but Jack Noonan replied for Williamstown CYMS. Nick Ebinger (a quality Williamstown VFL listed player) was lively in attack but off target with (1-2), but slotted a further major on the siren to give his side a 10 point lead at first change.

In the second stanza, SMS stayed well in the contest for the first 10 minutes. Ned Baxter was playing particularly well across the centreline and 'Chippa' was able to add two goals – the second after a pass from Joel Mattiske – and Darcy Grant another. However, the Seagulls were able to respond, before lifting their intensity to add four majors in just 6 minutes mid-quarter to open-up a handy lead. The Saints steadied and defended well for the final 10 minutes of the term, but trailed by 24 points at the long interval.

In the third term, 'Willy' came out to play and lifted their intensity significantly. SMS was unable to go with them and the visitors booted 9-3 against 2-0 to sew up the game. It was a fine team effort featuring tackling, pressure, pace, fine kicking to position and marking, while goals were shared between a number of players. The Saints were well served by N. Baxter, Jake Evans, Henry Wong and Mattiske. Six-pointers came from Dolan – after a fine mark – and Jackson Strangward, but by orange-time the Seagulls held a commanding 69 point margin.

The final quarter saw more of the same 'Willy' adding 8-3 including four goals from the talented Ebinger. SMS tried hard and kicked three majors, two of them by Luke Brownhill (marking well) and the other from the reliable Dolan. By siren time, the Seagulls had increased their lead to 101 points with a fine display of football.

– Williamstown CYMS were very impressive and with Fitzroy appear to be the standout teams this season. Nick Ebinger is a high quality forward and booted (7-5) for the day.

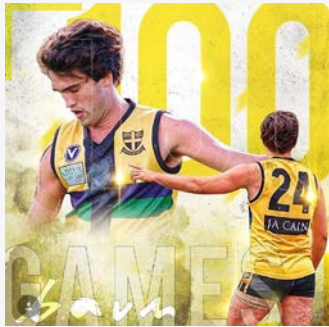

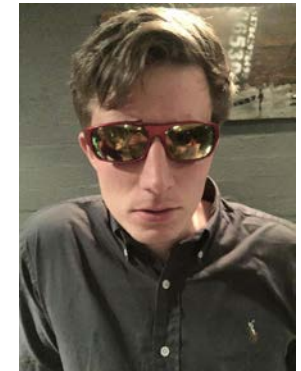
